### WEDNESDAY, 24TH OCTOBER, 1951.

- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable A. G. Cameron) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Standing and Statutory Committees--Statement by Mr. Speaker.—Mr. Speaker made a Statement, for the information of the House, with regard to the method of appointment, the conduct of business, and the scope of authority of the Standing and Statutory Committees.
- 3. NATIONAL SERVICE-MEDICAL EXAMINATION OF TRAINEE-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.-Mr. Holt (Minister for Labour and National Service), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement regarding the medical examination of a National Service trainee who had suffered from poliomyelitis.
- 4. Paper.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—
  Repatriation Act—No. 1 War Pensions Entitlement Appeal Tribunal—Report for year 1950-51.
- 5. EXCISE TARIFF REBATE ACT REPEAL BILL 1951.-Mr. Eric J. Harrison (Minister representing the Minister for Trade and Customs) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to repeal the Excise Tariff Rebate Act 1944.

Question—put and passed.

Mr. Eric J. Harrison then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time. Mr. Eric J. Harrison moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to.

Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Adermann reported accordingly.

Resolved-That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

 ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Eric J. Harrison (Vice-President of the Executive Council) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at twenty-five minutes past ten o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
