Message No. 55.

In accordance with the requirements of section fifty-six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to amend the *High Commissioner Act 1909-1945*.

Canberra, 8th May, 1952.

Ordered—That the foregoing Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.

Ordered—That Mr. Holt (Minister for Immigration) be granted an extension of time,
