SOCIAL SERVICES CONSOLIDATION BILL 1952.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the Amendment moved thereto by Mr. A.   - (3) the means test to be liberalized in the light of the change in money values "-
