TUESDAY, 17TH NOVEMBER, 1953.

1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable A. G. Cameron) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. DEATH OF MEMBER (MR. T. J. TRELOAR).—Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister) referred to the death on the 15th November, of Mr. T. J. Treloar, and moved, That this House expresses its deep regret at the death of Mr. Thomas John Treloar, who was at the time of his death Member of this House for the Division of Gwydir, places on record its appreciation of his meritorious public service and tenders its profound sympathy to his family in their bereavement. And Mr. Evatt (Leader of the Opposition) having seconded the motion, and Mr. McEwen (Minister for Commerce and Agriculture) and Mr. Robertson having addressed the House in support thereof, and all Members present having risen, in silence— Question—passed.
3. ADJOURNMENT AS MARK OF RESPECT.—Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister) then moved, as a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased Member, That the House do now adjourn. Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at twelve minutes to three o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past two o'clock p.m.
