Social Services Bill 1954.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the Amendment moved thereto by Mr. A. D. Fraser, viz.:—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:—" the Bill be withdrawn and redrafted to provide that the rates of age and invalid pensions be a minimum of £4 a week; and to provide similarly for increases in the rates of child endowment, widows' pensions, unemployment and sickness benefit, dependants' allowance and other social services corresponding to the increase in prices so as to restore at least the former purchasing value of these payments "---
