- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.--Mr. Speaker (the Honorable A. G. Cameron) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. MINISTERIAL ARRANGEMENTS .- Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister) informed the House that, during the absence through illness of Mr. Anthony, Sir Philip McBride (Minister for Defence) would act as Postmaster-General and would represent in this House the Acting Minister for Commerce and Agriculture.
- 3. Papers.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to Statute— Immigration Act—Return for years 1947 to 1953.

Nationality and Citizenship Act--Return for year 1953-54.

Overseas Telecommunications Act—Overseas Telecommunications Commission (Australia)— Eighth Annual Report, for year ended 31st March, 1954, together with financial accounts.

- 4. Special Adjournment.—Sir Eric Harrison (Vice-President of the Executive Council) moved, That the House, at its rising, adjourn until Tuesday, the 12th October next, at half-past two o'clock p.m. Question-put and passed.
- 5. Proposed Discussion of Matter of Urgency.—The Business of the Day having been called on-Point of Order .- Mr. Evatt (Leader of the Opposition) raised a Point of Order and asked whether Mr. Speaker proposed to place before the House the notice given by the Leader of the Opposition of his intention to raise a matter of urgent public importance under Standing Order No. 106A.

Speaker's Ruling .- Mr. Speaker informed the House that the matter proposed to be raised was out of

order as it was sub judice.

Proposed Dissent from Ruling .- Mr. Evatt moved, That Mr. Speaker's ruling which precludes the discussion of the matter mentioned in the Leader of the Opposition's letter to the Speaker dated 29th September, 1954, under Standing Order No. 106A and referring to the principles which will be placed before the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration in the forthcoming case on margins, be dissented from.

Point of Order.-Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister) raised a Point of Order that Standing Order No. 106A gave authority to Mr. Speaker to determine whether the proposed discussion was in order and his decision could not, therefore, be questioned by a Motion of Dissent.

- (3.) The Commonwealth shall, as soon as practicable after the commencement of this section, propose to the States a variation of the agreements with the States relating to hospital benefits that are in force under section forty of the National Health Act 1953 so that the hospital benefits provided under those agreements in respect of pensioners under the Social Services Act 1947-1954 shall be applicable, subject to similar conditions, to persons eligible for benefits under this section.
- '109A. A member of the Forces, and the widow of a member of the Forces, is Hospital entitled, subject to such conditions and restrictions as are prescribed, to accommodation treatment. and treatment at a hospital established for the purposes of this Act in respect of any illness or injury (including an illness or injury to a member of the Forces not connected with his war service).'.
