- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.-The Deputy Speaker (Mr. Adermann) took the Chair, and read Prayers.

4. MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL-FISHING INDUSTRY BILL 1956.-Mr. Deputy Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General :-

W. J. SLIM,

Governor-General.

Message No. 7.

In accordance with the requirements of section fifty-six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to establish a Fisheries Development Trust Account, and for purposes connected therewith.

Canberra, 8th March, 1956.

Ordered-That the Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith. Mr. Deputy Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.
