SCHEDULE OF THE AMENDMENTS MADE BY THE SENATE.

No. 1.—Page 3, after clause 6, insert the following new clauses:-

"6A. Section ninety-two of the Principal Act is amended by omitting paragraph Payment of maternity allowance in (a) of sub-section (2.) and inserting in its stead the following paragraph:— '(a) unless that woman or her husband—

ss that woman or her husband—

(i) is a resident of Australia as defined by the Income Tax and temporary

Social Services Contribution Assessment Act 1936–1957; and Australia. (ii) is not a resident of a place outside Australia specified in section

seven of that Act; or'

"6B. Section one hundred and four of the Principal Act is amended by Payment of omitting sub-section (2.) and inserting in its stead the following sub-section:-

(2.) No. 2.—Page 4, clause 9, lines 5 and 6, leave out paragraph (b), insert the following paragraphs:— (b) endowment or benefit in respect of a period commencing on or after that date; and

"(c) maternity allowance in respect of a birth occurring on or after that date."

On the motion of Mr. Roberton (Minister for Social Services), the Amendments were agreed to, after debate.

Resolution to be reported.

The House resumed; Mr. Lawrence reported accordingly. On the motion of Mr. Roberton, the House adopted the Report.
