- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.-Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.

- 4. Australian Capital Territory Representation Bill 1959.—Mr. Freeth (Minister for the Interior). for Mr. Holt (Treasurer), moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend section six of the Australian Capital Territory Representation Act 1948-1949.

Question—put and passed. Bill brought up, and read a first time.

Mr. Freeth moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr. J. R. Fraser), and the resumption of the debate made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

5. ALIENS BILL 1959.—Mr. Downer (Minister for Immigration) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the Aliens Act 1947-1952. Question—put and passed.

Bill brought up, and read a first time.

Mr. Downer moved, by leave, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr. Calwell), and the resumption of the debate made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

"That the Schedule to the Customs Tariff 1933-1958, as proposed to be amended by Customs Tariff Proposals introduced into the House of Representatives on the nineteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, be further amended as set out in the Schedule to these Proposals, and that on and after the twentieth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, or such later date as may be specified in the Schedule to these Proposals, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, reckoned according to standard time in the Australian Capital Territory, Duties of Customs be collected in pursuance of the Customs Tariff 1933-1958 as so amended."

8. NORTHERN TERRITORY (ADMINISTRATION) BILL 1959.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed by Mr. Nelson who moved, as an amendment, That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:—"the Bill be referred to a Joint Committee of Members of the Senate and the House of Representatives for investigation and report on constitutional reform of the Legislative Council of the Northern Territory so as to provide a greater measure of self determination by the people of the Territory".

Message No. 5.

In accordance with the requirements of section fifty-six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to amend the Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910–1956.

Canberra, 18th March, 1959.

Ordered—That the Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.

Mr. Hasluck (Minister for Territories) moved, That it is expedient that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to amend the Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910–1956.

Question—put and passed.

On the motion of Mr. Hasluck, the Resolution reported from the Committee was adopted by the House.

(a) twelve official members; and

(b) twelve elected members,

of whom one shall be elected Speaker.".
