5. SUPPLY-BUDGET DEBATE.-The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

General debate resumed on the question, That the first item in the Estimates, under Division No. 101.-Senate-namely-

be agreed to, and on the Amendment moved thereto by Mr. Calwell (Leader of the Opposition), viz.-That the first item be reduced by £1.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Lucock reported accordingly. Ordered-That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

6. ADJOURNMENT.--Mr. Cramer (Minister for the Army) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.
