### THURSDAY, 20TH APRIL, 1961.

- 1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable J. McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. Petition.—Mr. J. R. Fraser presented a Petition from certain citizens of the Australian Capital Territory praying that the Government will take immediate action to defer the implementation of rental increases of Government-owned dwellings in Canberra and conduct an inquiry into Canberra rentals at which evidence may be taken both from individuals and from community organizations. Petition received.
- 3. RETIREMENT OF HONORABLE G. LAWSON.—Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister) drew attention to the retirement from the House, at the close of this Parliament, of the honorable Member for Brisbane (Mr. Lawson). Mr. Menzies paid tribute to the long Parliamentary service of the honorable Member and also referred to the esteem in which he was held. Mr. McEwen (Minister for Trade) and Mr. Calwell (Leader of the Opposition) supported the remarks of the Prime Minister. Mr. Lawson made his acknowledgments to the House.
- 4. Paper.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute— Public Service Act—Appointment—Department of Works—R. Gaudion.
- 5. Message from the Senate.—A Message from the Senate was reported returning the following Bill without amendment:-

NATIVE WELFARE CONFERENCE—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—MOTION FOR PRINTING PAPER.—Mr. Hasluck (Minister for Territories), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to the work of the Native Welfare Conference held in Canberra in January last, and, by command of His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth, laid upon the Table the following Paper:-Native Welfare Conference—Ministerial Statement—and moved, That the Paper be printed.

- 11. Australian Capital Territory—Joint Committee.—Mr. Speaker informed the House that the Prime Minister had appointed Mr. Fairbairn to be a member of the Joint Committee on the Australian Capital Territory to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. Howse.
- 12. Message from the Administrator—Foot and Mouth Disease Bill 1961.—Mr. Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth:—

Message No. 5.

In accordance with the requirements of section fifty-six of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to establish a Foot and Mouth Disease Eradication Trust Account in respect of the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory of Australia, and for purposes connected therewith.

Canberra, 20th April, 1961.

Ordered—That the Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.

#### (In the Committee.)

Mr. D. A. Cameron (Minister for Health) moved, That it is expedient that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to establish a Foot and Mouth Disease Eradication Trust Account in respect of the Australian Capital Territory and the Northern Territory of Australia, and for purposes connected therewith.

Question—put and passed. Resolution to be reported.

The House resumed; Mr. Lucock reported accordingly.

Mr. Cameron moved, pursuant to contingent notice, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent the remaining stages being passed without delay.

On the motion of Mr. Cameron, the Resolution reported from the Committee was adopted by the House. Ordered—That Mr. Cameron and Mr. Opperman do prepare and bring in a Bill to carry out the foregoing Resolution.

Bill brought up by Mr. Cameron, and read a first time.

Mr. Cameron moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr. A. D. Fraser), and the resumption of the debate made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

13. Commonwealth Electoral Bill 1961.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed.

Debate adjourned (Mr. Beazley), and the resumption of the debate made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

14. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Davidson (Postmaster-General) moved, That the House do now adjourn. Debate ensued.

Closure.—Mr. Davidson moved, That the question be now put.
