1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir John McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. QUESTIONS.—Questions without notice were answered.
3. PAPERS.—The following Papers were presented, by command of His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth—
 Tariff Board Act—Special Advisory Authority—Report—Linoleum.
 Ordered to be printed.
 Christmas Island—Report for year 1960–61.
 Nauru—Report to the General Assembly of the United Nations on Administration of Nauru for year 1960–61.
 New Guinea—Report to the General Assembly of the United Nations on Administration of New Guinea for year 1960–61.
 The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—
 Australian National University Act—Australian National University—Report for 1961.
4. WAYS AND MEANS [“GRIEVANCE DAY”].—Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 291, the Order of the Day having been read for going into the Committee of Ways and Means—
 Question proposed—That the Speaker do now leave the Chair.
 Debate ensued.
 It being fifteen minutes to one o'clock p.m., the debate was interrupted in accordance with Standing Order No. 291.
 Question—That the Speaker do now leave the Chair—put and negatived.
 Ordered—That the House will, at a later hour this day, resolve itself into the said Committee.
5. STATES GRANTS (ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE) BILL (No. 2) 1962.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—
 Debate resumed.
 Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.
 The House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to.
 Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Lucock reported accordingly.
 On the motion of Mr. Fairbairn (Minister for Air), the House adopted the Report, and the Bill was read a third time.

6. COMMON MARKET NEGOTIATIONS—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—MOTION FOR PRINTING PAPER.—Mr. Menzies (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement with reference to his discussions overseas on the Common Market problem and reviewed negotiations taking place concerning Great Britain's application to become a member of the European Economic Community. Mr. Menzies then, by command of His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth, laid upon the Table the following Paper:—

Common Market Negotiations—Ministerial Statement, 9th August, 1962.

Mr. Hasluck (Minister for Territories) moved, That the Paper be printed.

Suspension of Standing Orders—Extended Time for Speech.—Mr. Hasluck moved, by leave, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent Mr. Whitlam making his speech without limitation of time.

Question—put and passed.

Debate ensued.

Debate adjourned (*Mr. Wentworth*), and the resumption of the debate made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
