8. TARIFF BOARD BILL (No. 2) 1962.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole for the further consideration of the Bill.

(In the Committee.)

Clauses 1 to 4 agreed to.

Clause 5 debated and agreed to.

Clauses 6 to 9 agreed to.

New clause—

On the motion of Mr. Wentworth, the following new clause was added to the Bill, after debate:—

" 10. After section thirty-five of the Principal Act the following section is inserted:—

' 35A.—(1) Where, in consequence of a report of the Board or of an authority, action has been taken under a law of the Commonwealth to prohibit the importation of a class of goods except in accordance with a licence granted under that law, the Minister shall, at reasonable intervals, cause to be published in the *Gazette* notices, in accordance with this section, in respect of the licences so granted.

' (2.) Notice under this section shall specify—

(a) the class of goods to which the notice relates;

(b) the names and places of business of the persons to whom licences in respect of goods of that class were granted during the period to which the notice relates; and

(c) the total value of all the goods covered by the licences to which the notice relates.

'(3.) The first notice under this section in relation to a class of goods shall relate to a period commencing on the date on which the prohibition of the importation of those goods took effect, and each subsequent notice in relation to that class of goods shall relate to a period commencing at the expiration of the period to which the last preceding notice related.'''

Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported with an amendment.

The House resumed; Mr. Lucock reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. McEwen (Minister for Trade), by leave, the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

9. ADVANCE TO THE TREASURER 1961-62—STATEMENT OF EXPENDITURE.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider the Statement.

(In the Committee.)

Statement taken as a whole, and agreed to, after debate.

Mr. Swartz (Minister for Repatriation) moved, That the following Resolution be reported to the House:—

That the Committee agrees with the Statement for the year 1961-62 of Heads of Expenditure and the Amounts charged thereto pursuant to Section 36A of the *Audit Act* 1901-1961.

The House resumed; Mr. Drury reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr. Swartz, the Resolution reported from the Committee was adopted by the House.

10. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Swartz (Minister for Repatriation) moved, That the House do now adjourn.
