1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir John McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PETITIONS.—Sir Wilfrid Kent Hughes presented a Petition from certain citizens of the Commonwealth praying that the Government remove section 127, and the words discriminating against Aborigines in section 51, of the Commonwealth Constitution, by the holding of a referendum at an early date.  
Petition received.  
Mr. Cairns presented a Petition from certain electors of the Commonwealth praying that the pension increase of ten shillings proposed in the 1963 Budget be granted to all age, invalid and widow pensioners.  
Petition received and read.
3. QUESTIONS.—Questions without notice were answered.
4. PAPERS.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to statute—  
Atomic Energy Act—Australian Atomic Energy Commission—Eleventh Annual Report and financial statements, together with the Auditor-General's Report, for year 1962-63.  
Meat Export Control Act—Australian Meat Board—Twenty-eighth Annual Report, for year 1962-63, together with Statement by Minister regarding the operation of the Act.
5. WOOL PROMOTION—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT.—Sir Robert Menzies (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement informing the House of the decision of the Government to assist the wool growing industry to finance an expanded wool promotion campaign.  
Mr. Pollard and Mr. Adermann (Minister for Primary Industry), by leave, also made Statements with reference to the matter.  
Mr. Beaton asked leave to make a Statement in connexion with the matter.  
Objection being raised, leave not granted.  
*Suspension of Standing Orders moved.*—Mr. Calwell (Leader of the Opposition) moved, That so much of the Standing Orders be suspended as would prevent Mr. Beaton making a Statement.

6. FLUORIDATION OF WATER SUPPLY IN CANBERRA AREA.—Mr. Killen moved, pursuant to notice, That, in view of conflicting evidence available on the value of fluoridation of water, this House is of opinion that the decision to introduce fluoride into the water in the Canberra area should be suspended.

Mr. Beazley moved, as an amendment, That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof:—

" a Select Committee be appointed to inquire into the advisability of introducing fluoride into the water supply of the Australian Capital Territory.

That the Committee consist of seven members, four to be appointed by the Prime Minister and three to be appointed by the Leader of the Opposition.

That every appointment of a member of the Committee be forthwith notified in writing to the Speaker.

That the Chairman be one of the members appointed by the Prime Minister.

That five members of the Committee constitute a quorum.

That any member of the Committee have power to add a protest or dissent to the report of the Committee.

That the Committee have power to send for persons, papers and records, to sit during any adjournment of the House and to adjourn from place to place.

That the Committee report to the House as soon as possible.

That the foregoing provisions of this resolution, so far as they are inconsistent with the Standing Orders, have effect notwithstanding anything contained in the Standing Orders".
