1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir John McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. QUESTIONS.—Questions without notice were asked.
3. GOVERNOR-GENERAL—SWEARING-IN OF LORD CASEY.—Sir Robert Menzies (Prime Minister) formally advised the House that Lord Casey had this morning been sworn-in as Governor-General and, on behalf of all Members, extended good wishes to His Excellency and Lady Casey.
4. PAPERS.—The following papers were presented, pursuant to statute—  
Medical Research Endowment Act—National Health and Medical Research Council—Twenty-seventh Annual Report, for 1964.  
War Service Homes Act—Director of War Service Homes—Report for year 1964-65.
5. NORTHERN TERRITORY (ADMINISTRATION) BILL 1965.—Mr. Barnes (Minister for Territories), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Northern Territory (Administration) Act 1910-1962*.  
Bill read a first time.  
Mr. Barnes moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.  
Debate adjourned (Mr. Luchetti), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
6. WHEAT TAX BILL 1965.—The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—  
Debate resumed.  
Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.  
Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.  
On the motion of Mr. Adermann (Minister for Primary Industry), the Bill was read a third time.
7. LOAN (WAR SERVICE LAND SETTLEMENT) BILL 1965.—The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—  
Debate resumed.  
Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.  
*Message from the Governor-General.*—Mr. Speaker announced the receipt of message No. 116, dated 22nd September, 1965, from His Excellency the Governor-General recommending an appropriation of moneys for the purposes of the Bill.  
Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.  
Mr. Adermann (Minister for Primary Industry) moved, That the Bill be now read a third time.  
Debate ensued.  
Question—put and passed.—Bill read a third time.
8. DIESEL FUEL TAX BILL (NO. 1) 1965.—The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—  
Debate resumed.

On the motion of Mr. Bury (Minister representing the Minister for Customs and Excise), the Bill was read a third time.

9. DIESEL FUEL TAX BILL (NO. 2) 1965.—The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr. Bury (Minister representing the Minister for Customs and Excise), the Bill was read a third time.

10. DIESEL FUEL TAXATION (ADMINISTRATION) BILL 1965.—The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr. Bury (Minister representing the Minister for Customs and Excise), the Bill was read a third time.

11. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Bury (Minister for Housing) moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

*Member named.*—Mr. Speaker named the honorable member for Bass (Mr. Barnard) for again interjecting after a warning had been given by the Chair.

Mr. Hasluck (Minister for External Affairs) moved, That the honorable Member for Bass be suspended from the service of the House.

Mr. Barnard having apologized to, and the apology having been accepted by, the Chair, the matter was not further proceeded with.

Debate continued.

Question—That the House do now adjourn—put and passed.

And then the House, at twenty-six minutes to twelve o'clock midnight, adjourned until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
