### WEDNESDAY, 12 APRIL 1967

- 1 The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable W. J. Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 MINISTERIAL ARRANGEMENTS: Mr Holt (Prime Minister) informed the House that, during the absence abroad of Mr McEwen (Minister for Trade and Industry), Mr Sinclair (Minister for Social Services) would act as Minister for Trade and Industry.
- 3 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.
- 4 SALES TAX (EXEMPTIONS AND CLASSIFICATIONS) BILL (No. 2) 1967: Mr McMahon (Treasurer) presented a Bill for an Act to amend the law relating to Sales Tax with respect to Seat Belt Assemblies designed for the Protection of Persons in Motor Vehicles.

Bill read a first time.

Mr McMahon moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Crean), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

- 5 Social Services Bill 1967: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the amendment moved thereto by Mr Daly, viz.—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof: "whilst not opposing the provisions of the Bill, the House condemns the Government because it has failed to—
  - (1) eliminate the injustices of discrimination between the rates of married and single pensioners;
  - (2) increase adequately all rates of pensions and social service benefits to meet the increased cost of living;
  - (3) institute a national inquiry into poverty and social welfare in Australia;
  - (4) carry out its policy of abolishing the means test as promised as long ago as 1949, and
  - (5) make benefits retrospective to the date of the last elections, 26 November 1966"—Debate resumed.
  - Debate adjourned (Mr L. H. Irwin), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for a later hour this day.
- 6 PRIME MINISTER'S VISIT TO ASIA, MARCH-APRIL 1967—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT: Mr Holt (Prime Minister), by leave, made a ministerial statement with reference to his recent visit to Cambodia, Laos, Taiwan and South Korea.
  - Mr Whitlam (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, also made a statement with reference to the matter.

- 7 Social Services Bill 1967: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the amendment moved thereto by Mr Daly, viz.—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof: "whilst not opposing the provisions of the Bill, the House condemns the Government because it has failed to—
  - (1) eliminate the injustices of discrimination between the rates of married and single pensioners;
  - (2) increase adequately all rates of pensions and social service benefits to meet the increased cost of living;

Message from the Governor-General: Mr Speaker announced the receipt of message No. 9, dated 4 April 1967, from His Excellency the Governor-General recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purposes of the Bill.

The House resolved itself into a committee of the whole.

Clauses 20 to 23, by leave, taken together, and agreed to, after debate.

Clause 24—

Mr Daly moved—That the clause be postponed.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Remainder of Bill, by leave, taken as a whole, and agreed to, after debate.

Bill to be reported without amendment.

The House resumed; Mr Lucock reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr Sinclair (Minister for Social Services), the House adopted the report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

9 ADJOURNMENT: Mr Sinclair (Minister for Social Services) moved—That the House do now adjourn.
