## TUESDAY, 9 MAY 1967

- 1 The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment. The Acting Speaker (Mr Lucock) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.
- 3 COST OF F-111 AIRCRAFT PROGRAMME—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—MOTION TO TAKE NOTE OF PAPER: Mr Howson (Minister for Air), by leave, made a ministerial statement with reference to the cost of F-111 aircraft and associated equipment being purchased in the United States of America for the Royal Australian Air Force, and, by command of His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth, presented the following paper:

Cost of F-111 Aircraft Programme—Ministerial statement, 9 May 1967—and moved—That the House take note of the paper.

- Debate adjourned (Mr Barnard—Deputy Leader of the Opposition), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 4 Message from the Administrator—Assent to Bill: A message from His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth was announced informing the House that His Excellency, in the name of Her Majesty, had assented to the following Bill:

- 5 INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT GRANTS BILL 1967: Mr Sinclair (Acting Minister for Trade and Industry), by leave, presented a Bill for an Act to provide for the Payment by the Commonwealth of Grants in respect of Industrial Research and Development.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Sinclair moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

- Debate adjourned (Mr Connor), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 6 SALES TAX (EXEMPTIONS AND CLASSIFICATIONS) BILL (No. 2) 1967: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed—Bill read a second time.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr Kelly (Minister for Works), the Bill was read a third time.

7 NATIONAL LIBRARY BILL 1967: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—Debate resumed.

Question-put and passed-Bill read a second time.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr Snedden (Minister for Immigration), the Bill was read a third time.

8 AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY—JOINT COMMITTEE: Mr Acting Speaker informed the House of the following appointments of Senators and Members as members of the Joint Committee on the Australian Capital Territory:

Senators Branson, Morris and Wood had been appointed by the Leader of the Government in the Senate, and Senators Devitt and Toohey by the Leader of the Opposition in that House.

Mr England and Mr Fox had been appointed by the Prime Minister, and Mr Daly and Mr J. R. Fraser by the Leader of the Opposition in this House.

9 TASMANIA GRANT (FIRE RELIEF) BILL 1967: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed—Bill read a second time.

Message from the Governor-General: Mr Acting Speaker announced the receipt of message No. 22, dated 20 April 1967, from His Excellency the Governor-General recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purposes of the Bill.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

Mr Howson (Minister assisting the Treasurer) moved—That the Bill be now read a third time.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed—Bill read a third time.
