- 1 The House met, at twenty minutes past three o'clock p.m. Mr Speaker (the Honourable W. J. Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 Petition: Mr Munro presented a petition from certain constituents of the Electorate of Eden-Monaro praying that the House will request the Government to improve the Alpine Way and other roads constructed within the Kosciusko State Park by the Snowy Mountains Hydro-electric Authority, and used by the general public, to a standard set by the N.S.W. Department of Main Roads. Petition received and read.
- 3 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.
- 4 VISIT TO AUSTRALIA BY PRIME MINISTER OF NEW ZEALAND—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT: Mr Holt (Prime Minister), by leave, made a ministerial statement informing the House that, at his invitation, the Prime Minister of New Zealand, the Right Honourable K. J. Holyoake, would visit Australia next week for the purpose of discussions between Ministers of the Australian and New Zealand Governments in relation to defence policies and other matters. Mr Holyoake would be accompanied by the New Zealand Minister for Defence, the Honourable D. Thomson.
- 5 SENATE ELECTIONS—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT: Mr Holt (Prime Minister), by leave, made a ministerial statement informing the House that the Government had decided to invite His Excellency the Governor-General to communicate with the State Governors proposing that the next Senate elections be held on Saturday, 25 November 1967. When a reply was received from the States he would inform the House of the full timetable proposed for the elections.
- 6 MIGRATION AND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN ITALY AND AUSTRALIA—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—PAPER NOTED: Mr Snedden (Minister for Immigration), by leave, made a ministerial statement with reference to the main features of the new Migration and Settlement Agreement signed today between Italy and Australia and, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General, presented the following paper:

9 DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE—POWER AND WATER DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS IN QUEENSLAND: Mr Speaker informed the House that Mr Patterson had proposed that a definite matter of public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The failure of the Government to provide financial assistance to Queensland for urgently required power and water development projects".

The proposed discussion having received the necessary support—

Mr Patterson addressed the House.

Discussion ensued.

Discussion concluded.

- 10 POSTPONEMENT OF ORDER OF THE DAY: Ordered—That order of the day No. 1, government business, be postponed until a later hour this day.
- 11 States Grants Bill (No. 2) 1967: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time— Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed—Bill read a second time.

Message from the Governor-General: Mr Speaker announced the receipt of message No. 50, dated 7 September 1967, from His Excellency the Governor-General recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purposes of the Bill.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr Howson (Minister assisting the Treasurer), the Bill was read a third time.

12 APPROPRIATION BILL (No. 1) 1967-68: The House, according to order, resolved itself into a committee of the whole for the further consideration of the Bill.
