## WEDNESDAY, 15 MAY 1968

- 1 The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable W. J. Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 Petitions: Mr Hansen presented a petition from certain citizens of Queensland praying that this House will make a survey of the full requirements of pensioners of all types and adopt a policy for the progressive liberalisation of the means test resulting in its removal within three years.
  - Mr Griffiths presented a petition from certain electors of the Commonwealth praying that the Government implement Article 25 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights by providing increased social service and housing benefits for the aged, the invalid, the widowed and their dependants.

Petitions severally received.

- 3 DISTINGUISHED VISITORS: Mr Speaker informed the House that a delegation of six Members of the Indonesian Parliament, led by Major-General Dr Sjarif Thajeb, Vice-Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Republic, was present in the gallery of the House. On behalf of the House, Mr Speaker extended to the delegation a warm welcome.
- 4 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.

9 CANNED FRUITS EXPORT MARKETING BILL 1968: Mr Nixon (Acting Minister for Primary Industry), by leave, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Canned Fruits Export Marketing Act* 1963–1966 in relation to the making of Advances to the Australian Canned Fruits Board.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Nixon moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Beaton), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

10 NATIONAL SERVICE BILL 1968: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time— Debate resumed.

Debate adjourned (Mr Killen), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for a later hour this day.

11 Loan (AIRLINES EQUIPMENT) BILL 1968: Mr Freeth (Minister assisting the Treasurer), by leave, presented a Bill for an Act to approve the raising by way of Loan of Moneys in the Currency of the Federal Republic of Germany to be lent to the Australian National Airlines Commission, and for related purposes.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Freeth moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Crean), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

12 Loans Securities Bill 1968: Mr Freeth (Minister assisting the Treasurer), by leave, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Loans Securities Act* 1919-1959. Bill read a first time.

Mr Freeth moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Crean), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

13 RAILWAY AGREEMENT (QUEENSLAND) BILL 1968: Mr Freeth (Minister assisting the Treasurer), by leave, presented a Bill for an Act relating to a Supplemental Agreement between the Commonwealth and the State of Queensland with respect to the Collinsville-Townsville-Mount Isa Railway.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Freeth moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr C. K. Jones), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

14 TASMANIA AGREEMENT (HYDRO-ELECTRIC POWER DEVELOPMENT) BILL 1968: Mr Freeth (Minister assisting the Treasurer), by leave, presented a Bill for an Act relating to an Agreement between the Commonwealth and the State of Tasmania in respect of Financial Assistance for Hydro-Electric Power Development.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Freeth moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Barnard—Deputy Leader of the Opposition), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

15 WESTERN AUSTRALIA AGREEMENT (ORD RIVER IRRIGATION) BILL 1968: Mr Fairbairn (Minister for National Development), by leave, presented a Bill for an Act relating to an Agreement between the Commonwealth and the State of Western Australia in respect of Financial Assistance for the construction of a Dam on the Ord River and associated Works.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Fairbairn moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Patterson), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

16 CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION BILL 1968: Mr Bury (Minister for Labour and National Service), by leave, presented a Bill for an Act providing for Increases in the Salaries of certain Persons holding office under the Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1904-1967. Bill read a first time.

Mr Bury moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Webb), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

17 NATIONAL SERVICE BILL 1968: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—Debate resumed.

Debate adjourned (Mr Jarman), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
