## THURSDAY, 7 NOVEMBER 1968

- 1 The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable W. J. Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 PETITION: Mr Benson presented a petition from certain residents of Victoria praying that the shooting of all kangaroos and the export of kangaroo meat be banned and that a Commonwealth Department be established to conserve wild life on a national basis.

Petition received and read.

- 3 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.
- 4 PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE—REPORTS—STATEMENT BY MEMBER: Mr Cleaver (Chairman) brought up the following reports from the Joint Committee of Public Accounts:

One hundredth Report—Expenditure from Advance to the Treasurer (Appropriation Acts 1967–68);

One hundred and first Report—Treasury Minutes on the Eighteenth, Seventyseventh and Ninety-fourth Reports together with summaries of those reports—

and, by leave, made a statement in connection with the reports.

Ordered-That the reports be printed.

5 TERRITORY SENATORS BILL 1968: Mr Whitlam (Leader of the Opposition), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to provide for the representation in the Senate of the Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory, respectively.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Whitlam moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate, by leave, ensued.

7 POSTPONEMENT OF NOTICE: Ordered—That notice No. 1, government business, be postponed until a later hour this day. 8 INCOME TAX ASSESSMENT BILL (No. 5) 1968: Mr Freeth (Minister assisting the Treasurer) presented a Bill for an Act to amend the Law relating to Income Tax. Bill read a first time.

Mr Freeth moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Crean), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

9 INTERNATIONAL MONETARY AGREEMENTS BILL 1968: Mr Freeth (Minister assisting the Treasurer), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act relating to the International Monetary Fund.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Freeth moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Crean), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

10 LOAN BILL (No. 2) 1968: Mr Freeth (Minister assisting the Treasurer), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to authorize the raising and expending of Moneys for Defence Purposes.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Freeth moved--That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Crean), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

11 SERVICE AND EXECUTION OF PROCESS BILL 1968: Mr Bowen (Attorney-General), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend the *Service and Execution of Process Act* 1901–1963 with respect to the Service of Process on certain Corporations, and with respect to the making of Regulations.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Bowen moved-That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate adjourned (Mr Connor), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.

12 JUDICIARY BILL 1968: Mr Bowen (Attorney-General), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act relating to the Conditions and Restrictions subject to which Federal Jurisdiction is invested in Courts of the States.
