THURSDAY, 21 MAY 1970

- 1 The House met, at ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable Sir William Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 **PETITIONS:** Mr Street presented a petition from certain residents of Victoria praying that the export of all kangaroo products be banned immediately.  
Petition received and read.  
Mr Brown presented a petition from certain electors of the Division of Diamond Valley praying that the export of products made from kangaroos be banned and that legislation be passed to make the kangaroo a protected animal throughout Australia.  
Petition received.  
Mr James presented a petition from certain citizens of the Commonwealth praying that this House make legal provision for (1) a joint Commonwealth-State inquiry into inequalities in Australian education, (2) the immediate financing of special programmes for low income earners and others and (3) the provision of pre-school opportunities for all children.  
Mr Hurford presented a petition from certain citizens of the Commonwealth praying that the House take action to encourage the Minister for Immigration to review the decision of his Department with respect to Ernest Mandel and permit Ernest Mandel to enter Australia.  
Petitions severally received and read.
- 3 **QUESTIONS:** Questions without notice were asked.
- 4 **MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL—ASSENT TO BILL:** A message from His Excellency the Governor-General was announced informing the House that His Excellency, in the name of Her Majesty, had assented to the following Bill:

- 5 **GRIEVANCE DEBATE:** Pursuant to the provisions of standing order 106, the order of the day having been read—

Mr Anthony moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.  
Debate adjourned (Mr Patterson), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 8 AUSTRALIAN WAR MEMORIAL BILL 1970: Mr Nixon (Minister for the Interior), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to amend section 6 of the *Australian War Memorial Act 1962–1966*.  
Bill read a first time.  
Mr Nixon moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.  
Debate adjourned (Mr Daly), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 9 CUSTOMS TARIFF BILL 1970: Mr Chipp (Minister for Customs and Excise), presented a Bill for an Act relating to Duties of Customs.  
Bill read a first time.  
Mr Chipp moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.  
Debate adjourned (Mr Crean), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for the next sitting.
- 10 MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL—HOMES SAVINGS GRANT BILL 1970: Mr Speaker announced the receipt of message No. 21, dated 13 May 1970, from His Excellency the Governor-General recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purpose of an amendment to be made upon request by the Senate in the Homes Savings Grant Bill 1970.
- 11 MONEY BILLS—STATEMENT BY MEMBER: Mr Crean, by leave, made a statement with reference to the constitutional powers of the Houses of the Parliament in connection with Money Bills.
- 12 HOMES SAVINGS GRANT BILL 1970—SENATE'S REQUEST: The House, according to order, resolved itself into a committee of the whole to consider the amendment requested by the Senate.

Question—put and passed—Bill read a second time.
