1 The House met, at two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable Sir William Aston) took the Chair, and read Prayers.

2 Petitions: Mr Jones presented a petition from certain citizens of Australia praying that the House take immediate steps to ensure that emergency finance from the Commonwealth will be given to the States for their public education services which provide schooling for 78 per cent of Australia's children.

Petition received and read.

A similar petition was presented by Mr Dobie, and was received.

Mr McIvor presented a petition from certain employees of the Commonwealth praying that the Commonwealth Employees' Compensation Act be amended to (1) provide for no loss of wages for an employee on compensation, (2) compensate for all illness or injuries arising during employment and (3) provide for fair and open judgment of compensation claims.

Petition received and read.

A similar petition to that presented by Mr McIvor was presented by Mr Keating, and was received.

Mr L. R. Johnson presented a petition from certain electors of Australia praying that the Government revise its interpretation of the Geneva Protocol of 1925 relating to chemical agents of warfare, and declare that it regards all chemical substances employed for their toxic effects on man, animals or plants, as being included in the prohibitions laid down by that Protocol.

Mr L. K. Johnson presented a petition from certain citizens of the Commonwealth praying that this House make legal provision for (1) a joint Commonwealth-State inquiry into inequalities in Australian education, (2) the immediate financing of special programmes for low income earners and others and (3) the provision of pre-school opportunities for all children.

Mr Killen presented a petition from certain citizens of the Commonwealth praying that this House make legal provision for (1) the allowance of personal education expenses as a taxation deduction, (2) the removal of the present age limit in respect of the deduction for education expenses, (3) an increase in the deduction allowable for tertiary education expenses and (4) the exemption of non-bonded scholarships for part-time students from income tax.

Petitions severally received.

Mr Enderby presented a petition from certain residents of the Australian Capital Territory praying that a Committee of Inquiry, on which are represented the Department of Education and Science, institutions of tertiary education, practising educators, and the Canberra community, be instituted to inquire into the form that an Australian Capital Territory Education Authority should take, the educational principles and philosophy that should underly it, and its mode of operation and administration.

Petition received and read.

3 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.

4 Suspension of standing orders moved—Motion without notice: Mr C. R. Cameron moved—That so much of the standing orders be suspended as would prevent the honourable Member for Hindmarsh moving a motion for the establishment of a select committee to inquire into and report upon proposals made by employees' and employers' organisations and other interested parties for the modernisation of the Commonwealth's industrial laws.
