- 1 The House met, at ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable J. F. Cope) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 **PETITION:** The Clerk announced that Sir John Cramer had lodged a petition for presentation from certain electors of New South Wales praying that this House will immediately make a substantial Federal emergency grant to all State Governments for education services and carry out a public national survey to determine needs of the States after 1975.
Petition received.
- 3 **QUESTIONS:** Questions without notice being asked—
Mr Whitlam (Prime Minister) answering a question—
Closure of Member moved: Mr Gorton moved—That the honourable Member be not further heard.
Mr Whitlam proposing to move—That further questions be placed on notice—
Speaker's ruling: Mr Speaker ruled that the Prime Minister was not in order in moving that further questions be placed on notice, but that, in accordance with practice, he could ask that they be placed on notice.
Question—That the honourable Member be not further heard—put and negatived.
- 4 **PAPERS—PUBLICATION OF PAPERS:** The following papers were presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General:
Croatian terrorist activities in Australia—Copies of documents from the files of the Attorney-General's Department, the Commonwealth Police and the Australian Security Intelligence Organization.
Mr Enderby (Minister representing the Attorney-General) moved, by leave—
That this House, in accordance with the provisions of the *Parliamentary Papers Act 1908–1963*, authorises the publication of copies of documents from the files of the Attorney-General's Department, the Commonwealth Police and the Australian Security Intelligence Organization relating to Croatian terrorist activities in Australia presented to the House this day by the Minister representing the Attorney-General.
Question—put and passed.

- 5 **TELEVISION OF PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS—PROPOSED REFERENCE TO JOINT COMMITTEE ON THE BROADCASTING OF PARLIAMENTARY PROCEEDINGS:** Mr Turner moved, pursuant to notice—That a joint select committee be appointed to inquire into and report on:
 - (a) whether the televising of portion of the Parliamentary debates and proceedings is desirable, and
 - (b) if so, to what extent and in what manner the telecasts should be undertaken.

Mr Daly (Leader of the House) moved, as an amendment—That all words after “That” be omitted with a view to inserting the following words in place thereof: “the following matter be referred to the Joint Committee on the Broadcasting of Parliamentary Proceedings for inquiry and report:

- (a) whether the televising of portion of the Parliamentary debates and proceedings is desirable, and
 - (b) if so, to what extent and in what manner the telecasts should be undertaken.
- (2) That the committee, for any purposes related to this inquiry, have power to send for persons, papers and records.
- (3) That a message be sent to the Senate acquainting it of this resolution and requesting its concurrence”.

Debate continued.

Question—That the amendment be agreed to—put and passed.

Motion, as amended, agreed to.

- 6 FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND DEFENCE—PROPOSED JOINT COMMITTEE: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the motion of Mr Whitlam (Prime Minister) relating to the proposed Joint Committee on Foreign Affairs and Defence (*moved 15 March, see pages 52-3*)—

Debate resumed.

Question—That the motion be agreed to—put and passed.

- 7 PUBLIC SERVICE BILL 1973: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed.

- 8 MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE—AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY EVIDENCE (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS) BILL 1973: Message No. 14, dated 29 March 1973, from the Senate was reported transmitting for the concurrence of the House a Bill for “*An Act to amend the ‘Australian Capital Territory Evidence (Temporary Provisions) Act 1971-1972’*”.

Bill read a first time.

Mr Enderby (Minister representing the Attorney-General) moved—That the Bill be now read a second time.

Debate, by leave, ensued.

Question—put and passed—Bill read a second time.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr Enderby, the Bill was read a third time.

- 9 COMMONWEALTH ELECTORAL BILL (NO. 2) 1973: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—

Question—put and passed.

Debate resumed.

Suspension of standing orders—Extended time for speech: Mr Daly moved, by leave—That so much of the standing orders be suspended as would prevent Mr Beazley (Minister for Education) speaking for a period not exceeding 30 minutes.

Question—put and passed.

Debate continued.

Suspension of standing orders—Extended time for speech: Mr Daly moved, by leave—That so much of the standing orders be suspended as would prevent Mr Anthony (Leader of the Australian Country Party) speaking for a period not exceeding 30 minutes.

Question—put and passed.

Debate continued.

Debate adjourned (Mr Grassby—Minister for Immigration), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for a later hour this day.
