# WEDNESDAY, 17 OCTOBER 1973

  - Mr D. M. Cameron, Mr Cooke, Mr Drury, Mr Jarman, Mr McLeay and Mr Wilson—from certain citizens of Australia praying that the Government take no measures to interfere with the existing national health scheme.
  - Mr Hamer—from certain citizens of Australia praying that the House move to make available to the Tasmanian Government a special grant for the purpose of securing Lake Pedder in its natural state.

6 TAXATION REBATE FOR AGED PEOPLE—MINISTERIAL STATEMENT: Mr Crean (Treasurer), by leave, made a ministerial statement informing the House of the Government's decision to extend the range of income over which aged people will be entitled to the full taxation rebate announced in the Budget speech.

9 MENTAL HEALTH AND RELATED SERVICES ASSISTANCE BILL 1973: Dr Everingham (Minister for Health), pursuant to notice, presented a Bill for an Act to provide for Financial Assistance to States, Local Governing Bodies and Voluntary Organizations in respect of the provision of Medical or other Services or Facilities in relation to Mental Illness, Mental Disability, Alcoholism and Drug Dependence.

Clause 4—

Mr Lynch (Deputy Leader of the Opposition) moved—That the clause be omitted, and the following clause be substituted:

"4. Section 4 of the Principal Act is amended—

Interpretation.

- (a) by omitting from sub-section (1) the definition of 'approved auditor'; and
- (b) by inserting in sub-section (1), after the definition of 'Director', the following definition:—
  - "minerals" includes petroleum and natural gas;".".

Debate continued

Question—That the clause proposed to be omitted stand part of the Bill—put and passed. Clause 5—

Mr Lynch moved the following amendment: Page 2, omit paragraph (a) of proposed sub-section (1), substitute the following paragraph:

"(a) to assist in the provision of financial resources required by Australian companies engaging or proposing to engage in industries in Australia concerned with the manufacture, processing or treatment of goods, or with the recovery of minerals, for the purpose of facilitating and encouraging the establishment, development and advancement of those industries; and".

Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Mr Lynch moved the following amendment: Page 2, omit proposed sub-section (4),

substitute the following sub-section:

"'(4) Without limiting the generality of sub-section (1), the functions of the Corporation may be performed for the purpose of assisting Australian companies, being trading or financial corporations formed within the limits of Australia, in their trading or financial operations, and sub-section (3) does not restrict the performance by the Corporation of its functions in accordance with this sub-section.'."

Amendment negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clause 6-

Mr Lynch moved—That the clause be omitted, and the following clause be substituted:

"6. Section 7 of the Principal Act is amended by omitting subsections (4), (5) and (6) and substituting the following sub-section:

Powers of the Corporation.

'(4) The power of the Corporation to borrow moneys may be exercised both within and outside Australia.'.".

  - "(b) the Secretary to the Department of Secondary Industry;
  - (ba) the Secretary to the Department of Minerals and Energy; and".
- Clause 9, page 6, line 42, after "Industry" insert "and the Secretary to the Department of Minerals and Energy".
- Clause 9, page 7, line 2, after "Industry" insert "and the Secretary to the Department of Minerals and Energy".
- Clause 9, page 7, lines 7 and 8, omit "or in the office of Secretary to the Department of Secondary Industry", substitute ", the office of Secretary to the Department of Secondary Industry or the office of Secretary to the Department of Minerals and Energy".
- Clause 9, page 7, lines 10 and 11, omit "and the Secretary to the Department of Secondary Industry", substitute ", the Secretary to the Department of Secondary Industry and the Secretary to the Department of Minerals and Energy".
