THURSDAY, 3RD OCTOBER, 1907.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PAPER.—Mr. Mauger presented, pursuant to the direction of an Act of Parliament—
Post and Telegraph Act—Amendments of General Postal, Telegraphic, and Telephone Regulations—Statutory Rules 1907, No. 91.
3. WAYS AND MEANS.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.
Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. McDonald reported that the Committee had made progress and that he was directed to ask, That the Committee may have leave to sit again.
Resolved—That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
4. MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE—APPROPRIATION (WORKS AND BUILDINGS) BILL 1907-8.—Mr. Speaker announced the receipt of the following Message from the Senate :—
