OF THE

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

WEDNESDAY, 23RD OCTOBER, 1907.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PAPER.—Mr. Speaker presented—  
Commonwealth and State Parliaments—Correspondence relating to a Resolution of the Western Australian Parliament respecting the Tariff, and the Right of a State Parliament to Protest against Commonwealth Legislative proposals.  
Ordered to lie on the Table.
3. WAYS AND MEANS.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.  
Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. McDonald reported that the Committee had made progress and that he was directed to ask, That the Committee may have leave to sit again.  
Resolved—That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
4. ADJOURNMENT.—Sir William Lyne moved, That the House do now adjourn.  
Question—put and resolved in the affirmative.
