The Senate, having taken into consideration Message No. 23 of the House of Representatives, dated 1st April, 1908, acquaints the House of Representatives that the Senate has agreed to the following Resolutions:—

1. That a Select Committee be appointed, to join with a Select Committee of the House of Representatives, to inquire and report as to the best procedure for the trial and punishment of persons charged with the interference with, or breach of, the powers, privileges, or immunities of either House of the Parliament or of the Members or Committees of each House.
2. That the Members of this Senate upon such Committee be Senators Colonel Neild, Henderson, Turley, and Chataway; two to be a quorum.
3. That such Committee have power to send for persons, papers, and records; and that the first meeting of the Committee be held in the Senate Committee Room on Wednesday next, the 8th April, at 10.30 o'clock a.m.
4. That a Message be sent to the House of Representatives conveying the above Resolutions.
