Returned by Senate with requests for amendments, 107. Senate's Message considered and requested amendments not made, 107. Senate does not press its requests for amendments and agrees to the Bill, 108. Assented to, 109. *Act No. 27 of 1908.*

APPROPRIATION (WORKS AND BUILDINGS) BILL 1908-9.—Brought in on resolution from Committee of Ways and Means, and (Standing Orders having been suspended, p. 71) passed through all stages, 72. Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 77. Assented to, 83. *Act No. 23 of 1908.*

Agreed to by Senate without amendment, 108. Assented to, 109. *Act No. 25 of 1908.*

Assented to, 109. Act No. 26 of 1908.*
