9. MANUFACTURES ENCOURAGEMENT BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the consideration in Committee of the whole House of His Excellency the Governor-General's Message No. 1— Mu Suppler left the Choir, and the House mealured itself into a Committee of the Whole
