FRIDAY, 25TH JUNE, 1909.

- 1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- Message from His Excellency the Governor-General.—Supply Bill (No. 1) 1909-10.—The
 following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was presented, and the same was
 read by Mr. Speaker:—

DUDLEY,

Governor-General.

Message No. 1.

In accordance with the requirements of section 56 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act to grant and apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and ten.

23rd June, 1909.

Ordered to lie on the Table, and to be referred to the Committee of Supply.

3. Want of Confidence in the Government.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Fisher:—That the Government does not possess the confidence of this House—

Debate resumed.

Mr. Johnson addressing the House, and not having concluded his speech, the House ordered that he have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.

Ordered—That the debate be now adjourned, and that the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for Tuesday next.

4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Joseph Cook moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

Question—put and resolved in the affirmative.

And then the House, at ten minutes past four o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
