TUESDAY, 4 APRIL 1978

- 1 The House met, at 2.15 p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Right Honourable Sir Billy Snedden) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 DISTINGUISHED VISITOR: Mr Speaker informed the House that the Honourable Kingsford Dibela, M.P., Speaker of the National Parliament of Papua New Guinea, was within the precincts. With the concurrence of Members, the distinguished visitor was provided with a seat on the floor of the House.
- 3 Petitions: The Clerk announced that the following Members had each lodged petitions for presentation, viz.:
 - Mr Falconer, Mr Lucock and Mr Shack—from certain members and ex-members of the citizens forces of Australia praying for the resumption of the award of several distinctive reserve forces decorations and medals for long service and good conduct.
 - Mr Morris, Mr I. L. Robinson and Mr Scholes—from certain citizens praying for the establishment of a fund whereby loans can be made to means tested pensioners for the necessary maintenance of their homes.
 - Mr Morris—from certain citizens praying that a temporary student visa be granted to Mr Sriram of India.

11 SUPERANNUATION ACTS AMENDMENT BILL 1978: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed.

Question—put and passed—Bill read a second time.

Message from the Governor-General: Message No. 11, dated 9 March 1978, from His Excellency the Governor-General was announced recommending an appropriation of revenue for the purposes of the Bill.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr E. L. Robinson (Minister for Finance), the Bill was read a third time.

- 15 SOFTWOOD FORESTRY AGREEMENTS BILL 1978: The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—
 - Debate resumed by Mr Scholes who moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: "whilst not declining to give the Bill a second reading, the House is of the opinion that the Government should continue to provide funds to the States for new plantings in the same proportion as in previous agreements, of about 50 per cent, in order to ensure that reasonable continuity of planting rates is maintained".

Debate continued.
