 - (2) Correspondence to the Prime Minister from the Queensland Premier reminding the Prime Minister of his undertaking not to acquire land for Aboriginals in Oueensland.
 - (3) Minutes of a meeting in the Minister's office, 14 March 1978, Canberra, at which he directed that a Cabinet submission be prepared for him by his Department which would terminate the Aboriginal Land Fund Commission and make its operations subject to his direct political control.
 - (4) Correspondence of 24 February 1978 to the Prime Minister from the Queensland Premier reminding the Prime Minister of an undertaking in July last year by the Minister for Aboriginal Affairs not to proceed with the purchase of Glenore Station.
