- 1 The House met, at 10.30 a.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Right Honourable Sir Billy Snedden) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 Petitions: The Clerk announced that the following Members had each lodged petitions for presentation, viz.:
 - Mr Armitage, Mr Baume, Mr Cairns, Mr Dobie, Mr Fry, Mr Graham, Mr L. R. Johnson, Mr Keating, Dr Klugman, Mr Martin, Mr Neil and Mr Stewart—from certain citizens praying for the award of a medal to members of the World War II Jaywick and Rimau commando expeditions.
 - Mr D. M. Cameron, Mr MacKellar, Mr Martyr, Mr O'Keefe and Mr Viner—from certain citizens praying for the prohibition of pornographic material involving children.
 - Mr Baume and Mr Kerin—from certain citizens praying that the decision not to proceed with the Vocational Employment Training Scheme at Green Valley, N.S.W., be reversed and that funds be provided for further vocational employment training schemes in high unemployment areas.
 - Mr Cohen and Dr Klugman—from certain citizens praying that proposed changes to Medibank not be implemented and that there be consultation with the trade unions and the community.
 - Mr Cohen and Mr Wallis—from certain citizens praying for the replacement of the 1978-79 Budget by a budget which increases the level of economic activity, lowers unemployment, assists the disadvantaged and revives business and consumer confidence.
 - Mr D. M. Cameron—from certain citizens praying that the imperial system of weights and measures be restored.
 - Mr Dobie—from certain citizens praying that no measures be taken to implement those recommendations of the Royal Commission on Human Relationships that will further undermine and weaken marriage, child-care or the family.
 - Mr Hodgman—from certain citizens praying that expenditure on post-school education and Government schools be substantially increased and that certain other action be taken in connection with post-school education.
 - Mr L. R. Johnson—from certain citizens praying that pensions be increased twice yearly in line with rises in the Consumer Price Index.
 - Mr L. R. Johnson—from certain members of the Sydney University Post Graduate Representative Association and others praying that Commonwealth postgraduate research awards be adjusted annually in line with the consumer price index and not be taxed.
 - Mr L. R. Johnson—from certain citizens praying for the provision of funds for the construction and maintenance of an aged persons complex in the Electoral Division of Hughes.
 - Mr Wallis—from certain citizens praying for continued and increased Federal subsidies to maintain all existing South Australian country rail services.

Mr Yates-from certain citizens praying that the Medical Benefits Schedule be amended to preclude payment of benefits for abortions.
