TUESDAY, 9 MARCH 1982

- 1 The House met, at 1.45 p.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Right Honourable Sir Billy Snedden) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 DEATH OF FORMER MEMBER (MR W. T. ARTHUR): Mr Speaker informed the House of the death of Mr William Tevlin Arthur, a Member of this House for the Division of Barton from 1966 to 1969.
 - As a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased all Members present stood, in silence.
- 3 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.
- 4 MINISTERIAL ARRANGEMENTS: Mr Fraser (Prime Minister) informed the House that, during the absence abroad of Mr N. A. Brown (Minister for Employment and Youth Affairs), Mr Moore (Minister for Business and Consumer Affairs) was acting as Minister for Employment and Youth Affairs.
- 5 COMMONWEALTH DAY 1982-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT: Mr Fraser (Prime Minister), by leave, made a ministerial statement relating to the commemoration of Commonwealth Day and the significance of the Commonwealth. Mr Hayden (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, also made a statement on the matter.
- 6 STATE OF THE NATION-MINISTERIAL STATEMENT-MOTION TO TAKE NOTE OF PAPER: Mr Fraser (Prime Minister), by leave, made a ministerial statement relating to issues facing Australia and Australia's position in the light of international and domestic factors, and, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General. presented the following paper:

State of the nation—Ministerial statement, 9 March 1982.

Mr Sinclair (Leader of the House) moved—That the House take note of the paper.

Suspension of standing orders—Extended time for speech: Mr Sinclair, by leave, moved—That so much of the standing orders be suspended as would prevent Mr Hayden (Leader of the Opposition) speaking for a period not exceeding 35 minutes.

Ouestion—put and passed.

Debate ensued.

Debate adjourned (Mr Tuckey), and the resumption of the debate made an order of the day for a later hour this day.

7 ALTERATION OF HOUR OF NEXT MEETING: Mr Hodgman (Minister for the Capital Territory) moved—That the House, at its rising, adjourn until tomorrow at 3 p.m., or such time thereafter as Mr Speaker may take the Chair.
