- 1 The House met, at 10.30 a.m., pursuant to adjournment. Mr Speaker (the Honourable Dr H. A. Jenkins) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 PETITIONS: The Clerk announced that the following Members had each lodged petitions for presentation, viz.:
 - Mr Andrew, Mr I. M. D. Cameron, Mr Carlton, Mr Chynoweth, Mr Cross, Dr Everingham, Mr Hall, Mr Porter, Mr Robinson and Mr Young—from certain citizens praying that chiropractic services be included in Medicare when it is introduced.
 - Mr Andrew and Mr Young—from certain residents of South Australia praying that legislation be enacted to ban the advertising of alcohol from commercial television and radio.
 - Mr Andrew—from certain citizens praying that the excise on grape spirit used in fortifying wine be either withdrawn or modified in its method of application and collection.
 - Mr Cadman—from certain citizens praying that the findings of the Major Airport Needs of Sydney Committee be endorsed and proposals for an airport at Scheyville, N.S.W., be rejected.
 - Mr Fry—from certain citizens praying that the Canberra City Blood Bank not be moved to the Woden Valley Hospital.
 - Mr Johnson—from certain citizens praying that the Government of the United States of America be urged to work towards a peaceful settlement of Central American issues along the lines proposed by the Governments of Nicaragua, Mexico, Columbia, Venezuela and Panama.
 - Mr Mildren—from certain citizens praying that the Government refrain from ratifying the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women.
 - Mr Scott—from certain residents of South Australia praying that the Parliament require General Motors-Holden to continue its operations at the Woodville Plant, S.A.
