Clause 4—

Page 2, after paragraph 4 (b) insert the following paragraphs:

"(ba) by omitting from paragraph (7) (b) '3 months after the occurrence of' and substituting 'the recommendation period for';

(bb) by omitting paragraph (8) (b) and substituting the following paragraph: '(b) within the recommendation period for the vacancy:

(i) the Minister of State of the Commonwealth who administers the Australian Federal Police Act 1979; and

 (ii) the Ministers of the Crown of the participating States who are responsible for matters relating to the respective Police Forces of those States;

unanimously recommend a person for appointment to the office; and';".

Page 2, at the end of the clause add the following paragraph and subclause: "(d) by adding at the end the following subsection:

'(11) In this section:

"recommendation period", in relation to a vacancy, means the period beginning 3 months before, and ending 3 months after, the day on which the vacancy occurs.'.

"(2) The amendments made by paragraphs (1) (ba), (bb) and (d) apply in relation to a vacancy occurring after the commencement of this section.".

Bill, as amended, agreed to.

Bill to be reported with amendments.

The House resumed; Mr McLeay reported accordingly.

On the motion of Mr Bowen, by leave, the House adopted the report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.
