On the motion of Mr Beddall (Minister for Small Business and Customs), by leave, the House adopted the report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.

15 **CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT BILL 1991:** The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the Bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed by Mr McLachlan who moved, as an amendment—That all words after “That” be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: “whilst not declining to give the Bill a second reading, the House is of the opinion that the Customs Tariff Amendment Bill epitomises the

Government's failure to deliver an economic environment which would allow a revitalisation of Australian industry, in particular because it:

- (1) effectively breaks commitments to industry, in particular by failing to deliver, in conjunction with reductions in protection contained in the Bill, substantial reforms in areas which increase production costs in this country, including:
  - (a) comprehensive labour market reform to allow genuine enterprise agreements and voluntary unionism;
  - (b) promotion of full and effective competition in telecommunications;
  - (c) abolition of security of tenure on the waterfront and removal of cabotage on Australian coastal waters; and
  - (d) introduction of a comprehensive goods and services tax;
- (2) fails to reduce all protection to all industries including the textile, clothing and footwear and automotive industries to, at most, negligible levels (that is, between zero and five per cent) by the year 2000, in conjunction with a package of reform measures; and
- (3) fails to strengthen the existing anti-dumping procedures to allow Australian producers adequate defence against dumped and subsidised imports at a time when domestic protection is being phased out".

Question—That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the question—put.
