- 5 DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE-GOVERNMENT POLICIES AND UNEMPLOYMENT: The House was informed that Mr Reith (Deputy Leader of the Opposition) had proposed that a definite matter of public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The need for an urgent change in the mix and stance of Government policies which have been responsible for the current engineered recession in order to bring about a sustained recovery in the job market and thereby alleviate Australia's chronic unemployment problems".
 - The proposed discussion having received the necessary support-
 - Mr Reith addressed the House.
 - Discussion ensued.

7 MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE—INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS LEGISLATION AMENDMENT BILL (NO. 2) 1991: Message No. 209, dated 9 May 1991, from the Senate was reported transmitting for the concurrence of the House a bill for "An Act to amend legislation relating to industrial relations and practices. and for related purposes".

Bill read a first time.
