# MONDAY, 12 OCTOBER 1992

- 1 The House met, at 2 p.m., pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker (the Honourable Leo McLeay) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2 QUESTIONS: Questions without notice were asked.
- 3 PAPER: The following paper was presented: Social Security Act—Social Security Appeals Tribunal—Report for 1991-92.
- 4 DISCUSSION OF MATTER OF PUBLIC IMPORTANCE—STATE OF THE ECONOMY: The House was informed that Mr Reith (Deputy Leader of the Opposition) had proposed that a definite matter of public importance be submitted to the House for discussion, namely, "The persistent failure of the Government to give the Australian public a full and realistic assessment of the state of the economy as evidenced by yesterday's pressure on the Industry Minister to withdraw his statement that he lacked confidence that the growth figures in the Budget forecasts will be attained".

The proposed discussion having received the necessary support—

Mr Reith addressed the House.

Discussion ensued.

Discussion concluded.

8 MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE—AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY AMENDMENT (AUTONOMY) BILL 1992: Message No. 530, dated 8 October 1992, from the Senate was reported transmitting for the concurrence of the House a Bill for "An Act to provide for the autonomy of the Australian National University".

Bill read a first time.

Ordered—That the second reading be made an order of the day for the next sitting.

9 APPROPRIATION BILL (NO. 1) 1992-93: The House, according to order, resolved itself into a committee of the whole for the further consideration of the Bill.

Question—put and passed—Bill read a second time.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr Crean (Minister for Primary Industries and Energy), the Bill was read a third time.

Leave granted for third reading to be moved forthwith.

On the motion of Mr Johns (Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Health, Housing and Community Services), the Bill was read a third time.
