Mr R. D. C. Evans; Speaker stated that he would consider the matter raised and report to the House, 2468. The Speaker stated that, whilst he had no difficulty in accepting the Member's claim that an industrial dispute of some nature concerning electoral offices had occurred, it was not clear from the information the Member had presented that there was evidence of improper interference or attempted or intended improper interference with the free performance by Members of their duties as Members. Accordingly, he was not willing to allow precedence to a motion on the matter, 2512.

Mr Ferguson; Speaker stated that he would consider the matter, 557.

Mr Holding; Speaker stated that he would consider the matter and report to the House, 2405. The Speaker referred to the responsibility of Members to have regard to the rights and interests of citizens in their use of the privilege of freedom of speech, but advised the House that whilst acknowledging that some Members may take exception to the actions complained of, on the information available to him there was no evidence to support a conclusion that a *prima facie* case of contempt had been made out. Accordingly, he was not willing to allow precedence to a motion on the matter, 2422.

Mr Howard—

Speaker stated that he would consider the matter, 453. The Speaker stated that he had considered the article and had not felt there had been any attempt at improper interference with the performance of his duties as Speaker and on the information presented there was nothing which would cause him to allow precedence to a motion, 460.

Speaker stated that he would look at the issue, 569. The Speaker stated that the actions complained of were directed specifically at Members and would have affected their capacity to perform their duties as Members and, accordingly, would be justified in allowing precedence to a motion; motion to refer matter to Committee of Privileges agreed to, 593.

Speaker stated that he would consider the matter, 909. The Speaker stated that he had examined Mr Howard's remarks and the article and did not see that the allegations went to the powers, privileges or immunities of the House or its Members and was not willing to allow precedence to a motion on the matter, 921.

Mr Johns; Speaker stated that he would consider the matter, 116. The Speaker stated that, after having made inquiries with regard to the matter, he did not believe that any issue of privilege or contempt was involved, however he would not tolerate any mistreatment of staff of the Parliament in carrying out their duties, 124.

Mr Jones; Deputy Speaker stated that he would bring the matter to the attention of the Speaker, 1303. The Speaker stated that it was a borderline case but he was prepared to allow precedence to a motion on the matter; motion to refer question of whether the serving of defamation writs amounted to improper interference in the duties of the Member for Kennedy referred to Committee of Privileges, 1092.

Mr Keating; Speaker stated that he would consider the matter, 2332. The Speaker stated that the matter would be best left to the judgment of the House and accordingly he was prepared to allow precedence to a motion to be moved in relation to the matter. The Speaker presented papers in relation to the matter. Motion to censure of the Member for Chisholm debated and agreed to, 2345-9.

Mr Langmore; Speaker stated that he would look at the issues raised and report to the House, 811. The Speaker stated that, on the matter of newspaper articles referring to a draft report of the Standing Committee on the Environment, Recreation and the Arts, he accepted the committee's conclusion and was willing to allow precedence to a motion. On the matter concerning remarks attributed to Mrs Moylan on the ABC radio program AM, the Speaker stated that after examining the transcript it was not clear to him that private deliberations of the committee or the contents of a draft report had been disclosed and, accordingly, would not allow precedence to a motion, 819. Mr Langmore made a statement concerning unauthorised disclosure of draft report; The Speaker stated that he would allow precedence to a motion in respect of the matter; motion to refer matter concerning newspaper reports on proceedings of the Standing Committee on the Environment, Recreation and the Arts to Committee of Privileges agreed to, 981.

Mr Price; Speaker stated he would consider the matter and respond as quickly as possible, 1840. The Speaker said that no *prima facie* case of breach of privilege or contempt had been made out and that it was not desirable that he be represented in the proceedings. Mr Howard (Leader of the Opposition) asked the Speaker if he would be prepared to allow precedence to a motion to require the Commonwealth Ombudsman to have a copy of her report presented to the House. The Speaker stated that he would consider the matter and report back to the House, 1857. The Speaker stated that as no *prima facie* case of breach of privilege or contempt had been made out there was no basis for allowing precedence to such a motion, 1900.

Mr Reith; Acting Speaker stated that he would consider the matter and report to the House at a later time, 2001-2. The Acting Speaker advised the House that he did not believe anything improper had occurred or that there was evidence of an attempt to intimidate either the Speaker or himself. The Acting Speaker stated that he did not believe that there was *prima facie* evidence of a breach of privilege or contempt and that he was not willing to allow precedence to a motion on the matter, 2011.

The Speaker stated that the unauthorised disclosure or publication of the contents of a draft report or of the private deliberations of a committee could be regarded as a contempt and was prepared to allow precedence to a motion in respect of the matter; motion to refer matter to Committee of Privileges agreed to, 444. *And see "Statements".*

Mr Simmons; Acting Speaker stated that he would await the results of the committee's deliberations, 1971. Mr Simmons informed the House that the committee had determined that substantial interference with its work had not occurred, 2012.

Mr Sinclair; Speaker stated that he would consider the matter and report to the House later, 2347-8.
