#### 2 PRIVILEGE—COMPLAINTS OF BREACHES

Mr Langmore raised, as a matter of privilege, articles published in several newspapers of today which made reference to a draft report of the Standing Committee on Environment, Recreation and the Arts and purported to reveal conclusions reached by the committee. Mr Langmore stated that the committee had considered these matters and had concluded that publication of the material had caused substantial interference with its work. Mr Langmore asked that the matters be considered with a view to according precedence of a motion referring them to the Committee of Privileges.

Mr Langmore also raised, as a matter of privilege, remarks reportedly made by Mrs Moylan, a member of the Standing Committee on Environment, Recreation and the Arts, during an interview this morning on the ABC radio program AM. Mr Langmore stated that the committee was of the opinion that the views expressed by Mrs Moylan constituted a further substantial interference with the committee's work.

The Speaker stated that he would look at the issues raised and report to the House at a later time.

Privilege—Statement by Speaker

The Speaker referred to the matters of privilege raised earlier today by Mr Langmore concerning the Standing Committee on the Environment, Recreation and the Arts. On the matter of newspaper articles referring to a draft report of the committee, the Speaker said that the committee had followed the established procedures and had considered whether substantial interference had occurred. The Speaker said he accepted the committee's conclusion on this and was willing to allow precedence to a motion, although before a motion was moved the committee should take steps to seek to ascertain the source or sources of the disclosure.

On the matter concerning remarks attributed to Mrs Moylan during an interview on the ABC radio program AM, the Speaker said he had examined the transcript and that it was not clear to him that Mrs Moylan had in fact disclosed private deliberations of the committee or the contents of a draft report. Accordingly, he did not find a *prima facie* case had been made out and would not allow precedence to a motion.

Debate continued.
