VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

WEDNESDAY, 3RD AUGUST, 1910.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION BILL (1910).—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—and on the following amendment proposed thereto by Mr. Greene :—That the word “now” be omitted from, and that the words “this day fortnight” be added to, the motion—
Debate resumed.

And the House continuing to sit till after midnight—

THURSDAY, 4TH AUGUST, 1910.

Debate continued.

Question—That the word “now” proposed to be omitted stand part of the question—put and passed.

Question—That the Bill be now read a second time—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair ; and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(In the Committee.)

Clause 1 agreed to.

Clause 2 read.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed ; Mr. Poynton reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, this day, at a later hour, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

3. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Fisher moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Debate ensued.
Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at eight minutes past four o'clock in the morning, adjourned until this day at half-past two o'clock p.m.
