VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

TUESDAY, 30TH AUGUST, 1910.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. LAND TAX ASSESSMENT BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question— That the Bill be now read a second time.
 Debate resumed.
 Mr. Deakin moved an amendment, That, after the word "That", the following words be inserted, viz. :—"the form of land tax outlined by the Prime Minister, and provided for in this Bill, is unjust in its incidence and an abuse of Federal powers."
 Debate continued.
 Mr. Glynn addressing the House, and not having concluded his speech, the House ordered that he have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.
 Ordered—That the debate be now adjourned, and that the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for to-morrow.
3. PAPER.—Mr. Frazer presented, pursuant to Statute—
 Defence Act—Military Forces—Financial and Allowance Regulations Amended (Provisional)
 Nos. 155-159—Statutory Rules 1910, No. 75.
4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Fisher moved, That the House do now adjourn.
 Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at seventeen minutes past ten o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past ten o'clock a.m.
