- 1. The House met, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. PAPER.—Mr. Tudor presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General—
  - Sugar Industry—Copy of Letters Patent appointing a Royal Commission to inquire into and report upon the Sugar Industry in Australia. (In substitution for the Paper presented on 12th ultimo.)

Ordered to lie on the Table.

3. SUPPLY [ESTIMATES—ADDITIONS, NEW WORKS, BUILDINGS, ETC., 1911-12].—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

Subdivision No. 3 further debated.

Mr. Sinclair moved an amendment, That the amount of the subdivision be reduced by  $\pm 53,000$ . Debate continued.

The House resumed; Mr. Poynton reported accordingly. Resolved—That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

- 4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Tudor moved, That the House do now adjourn. Question—put and passed.
- And then the House, at twenty-nine minutes past ten o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past two o'clock p.m.
