Additions, New Works, Buildings, etc., 1912-13.

Resolved-That there be granted to His Majesty to the service of the year 1912-13, for the purposes of Additions, New Works, Buildings, &c., a sum not exceeding £2,789,092. And the said Resolution was, after debate, adopted by the House.
