VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

WEDNESDAY, 20TH NOVEMBER, 1912.

1. The House met, at half-past ten o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PAPERS.—Mr. Tudor presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General—
Imports, Rates of Duty payable, Local Production, Wages and Salaries paid, and Percentage of Local Production in certain Industries, 1908 to 1911—Statements showing, for—
The Commonwealth.
The State of Victoria.
Patent Medicines— Report by H. C. O. Willgerodt, Acting Federal Analyst, on Medicinal and Tonic Wines.
Severally ordered to lie on the Table and to be printed.
Mr. O'Malley presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General—
General Post Office, Perth—Particulars of Lands acquired for site, and of the prices to be paid therefor.
Ordered to lie on the Table.
3. CONSTITUTION ALTERATION (INDUSTRIAL MATTERS) BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the second reading—Mr. Hughes moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.
Debate ensued.
Mr. W. Elliot Johnson moved, That the debate be now adjourned.
Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.
Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for to-morrow.
4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Hughes moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Question—put and passed.
