1 The House met, at 12.30 p.m., pursuant to adjournment. The Speaker (the Honourable David Hawker) took the Chair, and read Prayers.

2 LONG SERVICE LEAVE (COMMONWEALTH EMPLOYEES) AMENDMENT BILL 2006

The order of the day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question—That the bill be now read a second time—

Debate resumed by Mr S. F. Smith who moved, as an amendment—That all words after "That" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words: "whilst not declining to give the bill a second reading and while welcoming the fact that the Government has extended long service leave protections to Telstra employees for a period of 3 years following the time that the Commonwealth ceases to have a controlling interest in Telstra, the House:

- (1) regrets the fact that the Government has offered no such protections to the up to 1800 existing Telstra employees who are currently members of the Commonwealth Superannuation Scheme (CSS) who will have that membership terminated as a result of the Telstra 3 privatisation;
- (2) considers the fact that the cessation of CSS membership will mean the Government's pension promise made to Telstra CSS members will not be kept;
- (3) notes that no comparable provision has been made to ensure the pension promise is met, as occurred in the Qantas privatisation;
- (4) notes that no other compensation is provided for;
- (5) condemns the Government for its failure in this regard; and
- (6) calls on the Government to immediately rectify the position for these disadvantaged Telstra employees".

- (5) acknowledges the significant Australian Government funding that is provided to local government to spend on locally determined priorities, such as roads and other local government services; and
- (6) commends local government elected officials who give their time to serve their communities—

And on the amendment moved thereto by Mr Albanese, viz.—That paragraph (1) be omitted and the following paragraph substituted:

"(1) supports a referendum to extend constitutional recognition to local government in recognition of the essential role it plays in the governance of Australia"—
