In particular that:

- (1) this security breach compromises the credibility and integrity of Australia's diplomatic relationships with key international partners; and
- (2) the Prime Minister has failed, over numerous days, to fully explain to the Australian people the details in relation to the leak and his involvement in it; and

That the matter be referred to the Australian Federal Police for a full investigation as to whether there has been any breach of the Crimes Act or other relevant legislation.

### 10 MESSAGE FROM THE SENATE—SAFE WORK AUSTRALIA BILL 2008

Message No. 151, 10 November 2008, from the Senate was reported returning the Safe Work Australia Bill 2008 and informing the House that the Senate insists upon its amendments disagreed to by the House of Representatives and desires the reconsideration of the bill by the House in respect of the amendments.
