- 1. The House met, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment .-- Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
- 2. POST AND TELEGRAPH RATES BILL (1920) .--- The Order of the Day having been read for the second reading-Mr. Wise moved. That the Bill be now read a second time. Mr. Tudor moved, That the debate be now adjourned. Question-That the debate be now adjourned-put and passed. Ordered - That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for to-morrow.
- 3. SUPPLY [ESTIMATES-ADDITIONS, NEW WORKS, BUILDINGS, ETC., 1920-21].-The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(In the Committee.)

Ordered, on the motion of Sir Joseph Cook-That the consideration of the General Estimates be postponed until after the consideration of Estimates for Additions, New Works, Buildings, &c.

Additions, New Works, Buildings, etc., 1920-21.

Vote-" The Parliament £2,000 " debated and agreed to.

Vote-" The Treasury £321" agreed to.

Vote—"The Home and Territories Department £41,327" agreed to. Vote—"The Department of Defence—Military £1,302,153" debated— Mr. Riley moved, That the vote be reduced by £1.

Debate continued.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. Chanter reported accordingly. Resolved-That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

4. ADJOURNMENT .-- Sir Joseph Cook moved, That the House do now adjourn. Question-put and passed.

And then the House, at twenty-five minutes to twelve o'clock midnight, adjourned until to-morrow at half-past two o'clock p.m.
