VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

FRIDAY, 22ND OCTOBER, 1920.

1. The House met, at eleven o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. WANT OF CONFIDENCE IN THE GOVERNMENT.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the following motion of Mr. Tudor :—That the Government be censured for their failure to make provision for the payment of 5s. per bushel cash at railway sidings for this season's wheat—

Debate resumed.

Mr. Gregory moved, as an amendment, That all the words in the motion after the word "Government" be omitted with a view to the insertion of the following words in place thereof :—

" , having guaranteed the producer 5s. per bushel at sidings for this season's wheat, should arrange for payment of same on delivery by cash and certificates, such certificates to be repayable in such instalments and at such periods as recommended by the Central Wheat Board ; and in the opinion of this House nothing should be done that will prevent the producer from receiving export parity for all wheat, including wheat for home consumption."

Debate continued.

Member Named.—Mr. Considine persisting in interjecting when directed by Mr. Speaker to refrain from so doing, was named by Mr. Speaker for disregarding the authority of the Chair.

Mr. Hughes moved, That the honorable Member for Barrier (Mr. Considine) be suspended from the service of the House.

Member removed from Chamber.—Mr. Mathews having been repeatedly called to order by Mr. Speaker, and continuing to disregard the authority of the Chair, Mr. Speaker called upon the Serjeant-at-Arms to remove the honorable Member who, accompanied by the Serjeant-at-Arms, thereupon retired from the Chamber.

Member Suspended.—Question—That the honorable Member for Barrier (Mr. Considine) be suspended from the service of the House—put.

The House proceeded to divide, but the Tellers appointed for the Noes refusing to act as Tellers—

Mr. Speaker declared the question resolved in the affirmative.

The honorable Member was, therefore, under Standing Order No. 59, suspended for a week, this being his second occasion, during this Session, of suspension, and he accordingly withdrew from the Chamber.

Debate, on original motion and amendment, continued.

Mr. Groom brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next day of sitting.

5. TREATIES OF PEACE [AUSTRIA AND BULGARIA] BILL.—Mr. Groom (for Mr. Hughes) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to carry into effect the Treaties of Peace with Austria and Bulgaria.

Question—put and passed.

Mr. Groom brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.

Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.

Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next day of sitting.

6. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General—
Ballarat Election Petition—Kean v. Kerby—Judgment of Mr. Justice Isaacs, and a Memorandum prepared by the Chief Electoral Officer in relation to the Judgment.

Ordered to lie on the Table, and to be printed.

7. ADJOURNMENT.—Sir Joseph Cook moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

And then the House, at ten minutes past four o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
